Points of Progress

- 1) **Switzerland:** Engineers created a device that allows people with prosthetic limbs to feel temperature for the first time. Unlike other systems that create sensations for people with prosthetic limbs, the MiniTouch sensor does not require surgery.
- 2) **World:** Paying rural residents for reforestation- while also allowing them to harvest timber- can strike a balance among social, economic, and environmental concerns.
