Points of Progress

- 1) Canada: A Vancouver neighbourhood is harnessing heat from wastewater to sustainably warm buildings. The False Creek Neighbourhood Energy Utility was the first in North America to recover heat from untreated sewage. The heated water is channeled back through a thermal grid of pipes, providing heat for buildings and 6,210 apartments, including the former Olympic Village.
- 2) World: Teaching positive psychology in schools may boost student well being. Positive psychology took shape when researchers began to study happiness instead of sadness in the 1990's.
- 3) United States: The University of Arizona is training more Indigenous teachers to expand their representation in elementary classrooms. Educators and students say that the 19th and 20th century history of Indigenous students' indoctrination in boarding schools is a source of apprehension over higher education, and many potential students have social and familial responsibilities in their home communities.
