Points of Progress

- 1) United States: Recycled glass- turned into sand-is shoring up Louisiana marshlands.** Glass Half Full Nola, a glass recycler, has collected 3.2 million pounds of glass since 2020. The company supplies pulverized product which can grow native grasses, and resist erosion. Some 40 tons of recycled sand in burlap bags have already been used for wetland restoration.
- 2) Egypt: A new corridor was discovered in the Great Pyramid of Giza, using noninvasive techniques.** A 30-foot corridor was discovered using infrared thermography, 3D simulations, and cosmic ray muon imaging. It was likely constructed to redistribute weight, either around an existing entrance or undiscovered chamber.
